Curriculum

- Required courses ensure that all students in the Global Health Nursing Certificate program
- Electives were selected to provide students with additional training
- Capstone projects should be designed to give students a better understanding of global health nursing, build on concepts learned in the classroom, and provide an opportunity for students to critically think about a problem or gain hands-on experience. Capstone projects may focus on research, laboratory methods, intervention implementation, service, policy, or evaluation. Involvement with ongoing or developing projects may include assisting with literature reviews, development of study instruments, data analysis, or field site preparation. Students will be required to present their capstone projects in a public forum.

Faculty Advisor Responsibilities

Faculty advisors should oversee the planning and progress of the capstone project and attend the capstone presentations. Your guidance is an important aspect of the certificate program and in helping us to assess the impact of our students. We hope that these capstone projects not only provide the students with opportunities to gain experience but also that they produce information and tools for use in promoting global health equity. Specific responsibilities include:

- Assisting with planning of project
- Providing feedback on proposed project
- Being available via email or phone for problem solving if needed
- Reviewing/co-grading (with thesis/dissertation advisor if applicable)
- Review capstone presentation seminar material (e.g., poster)
- Completion of the faculty advisor evaluation
